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

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


Fig. 1. Montien Boonma, Venus of Bangkok, 1991




Fig. 14. Chalood Nimsamer, Songkran Festival, 1956




Fig. 16. Prasong Padmanuja, Wat Pho, 1958

National Gallery collection




Fig. 17. Damrong Wong-Uparaj, Fishing Village, 1960




Fig. 19. Prapat Jothaprasert, Festival No. 2, 1964




Fig. 24. Tawan Duchanee, Bhuridatta Jataka, 1974




Fig. 25. Angkarn Kalayanapongse, Right Views, 1982

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


Fig. 26. Pichai Nirand, Faith and Wall, 1963




Fig. 31. Hatai Bunnag, Palace Garden, 1982




Fig. 33. Somyos Traisenee, The Radiance of Royal Charisma, 1987




Fig. 37. Chalood Nimsamer, Lokuttara, 1991




Fig. 39. Apichai Piromrak, New Image of Wheel of Life,  
1991, mixed technique, 150 x 130cm




Fig. 40. Pabtawan Suwannakoot, Crystal Elephant, 1987




Fig. 45. Kreangkrai Vongpitirat, Defeating Mara, 1995




Fig. 49. Udom Chimpukdee, Symbol of the Growing of Technology, 1995(Gold, 1<sup>st</sup> SVOA Contemporary Art) welding, 91 x 138 x 188cm




Fig. 51. Members of the Faculty of Painting Sculpture and Graphic Arts, Silpakorn University, Work of Art in the Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration of His Majesty's Accession to the Throne, 1995 mixed technique, 50 pieces each 23 x 23 x 20cm




Fig. 53. Montien Boonma, Arokhayasala, Temple of Mind,

370 x 250 x 250cm




Fig. 54. Chalermchai Kositpipat, Phra Piamlonduaymetta,  
1997, acrylic on canvas, 90 x 56cm




Fig. 55. Panya Vijinthansarn, Anachakrawan, 1996

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


Fig. 60. Chakrabhand Posayakrit, The Saga of Ramayana,

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


Fig. 63. Santi Thongsuk, Breath in the Capital City, 1995
