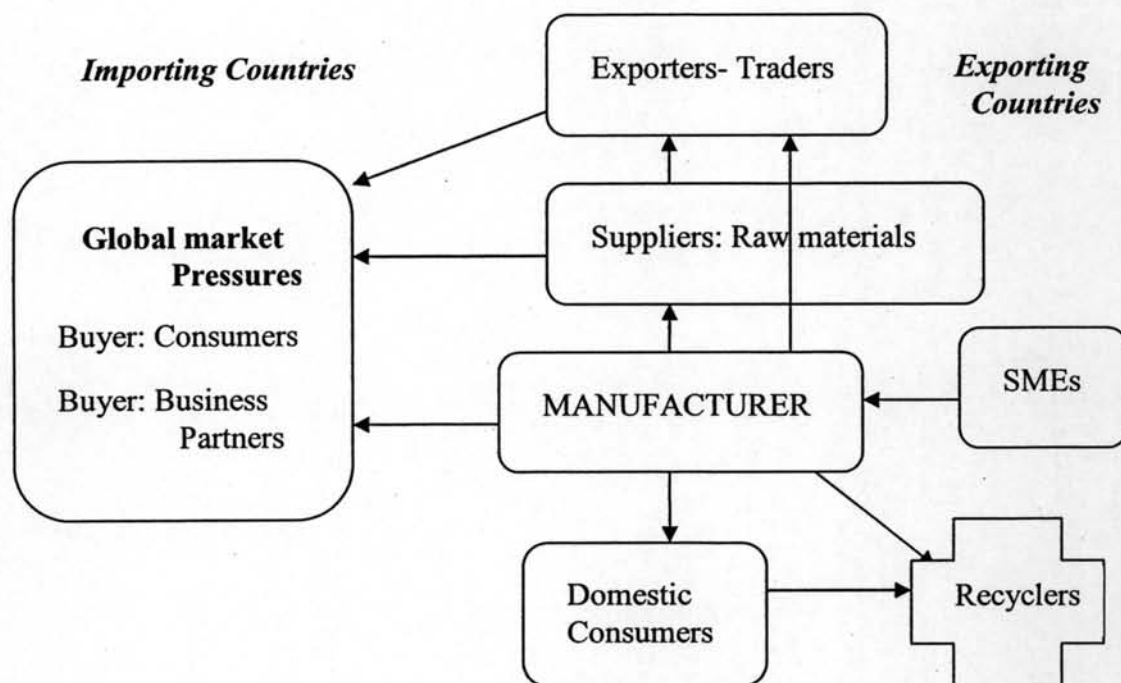

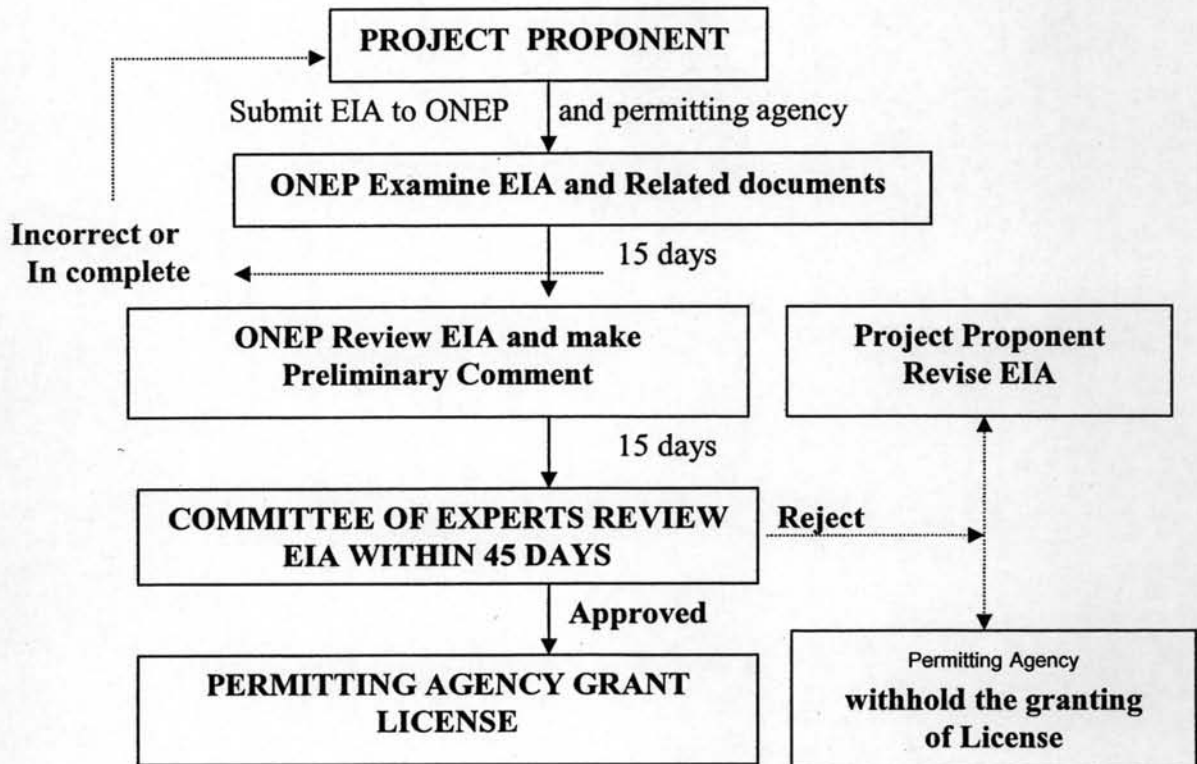
APPENDIX A

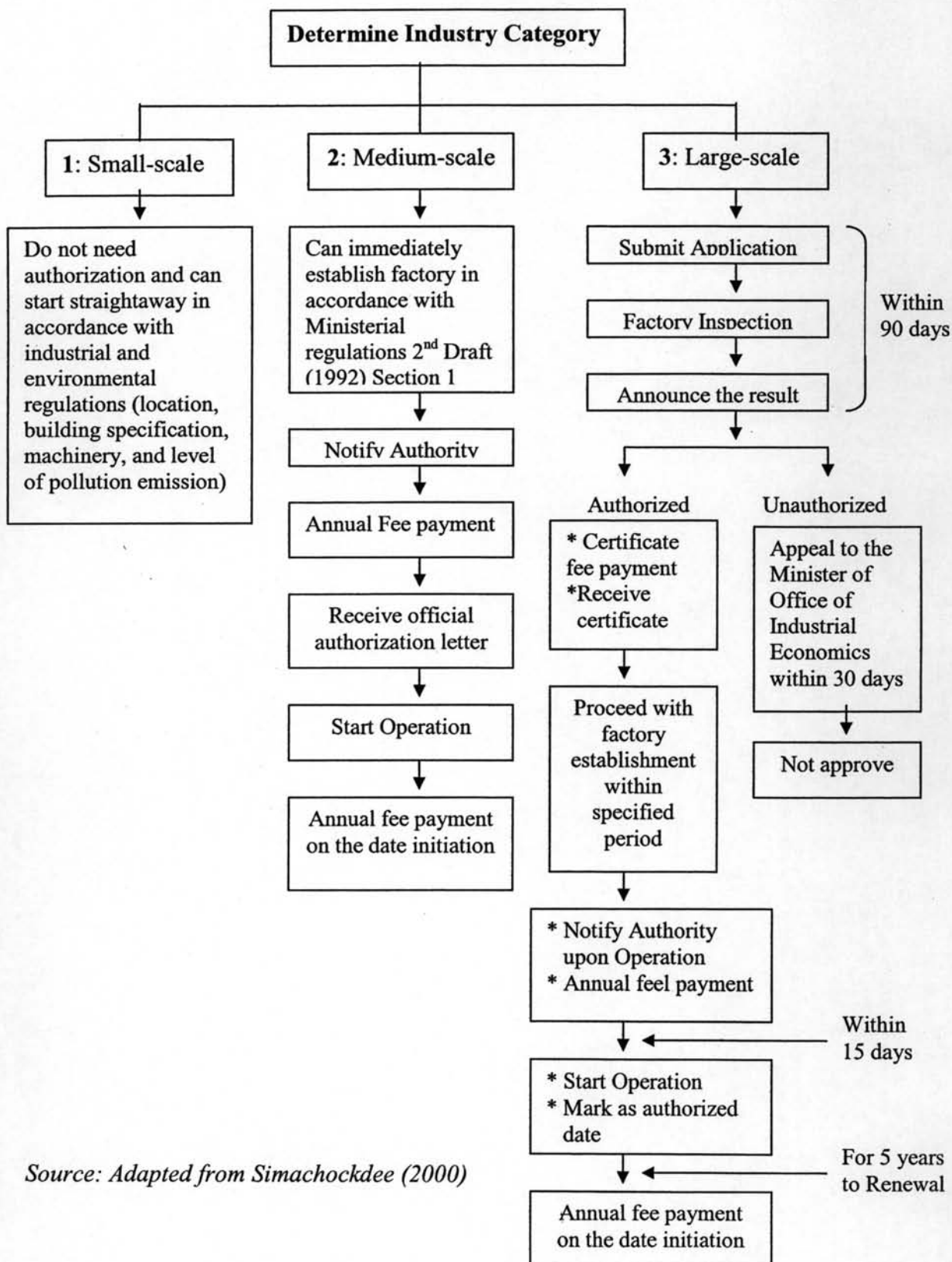

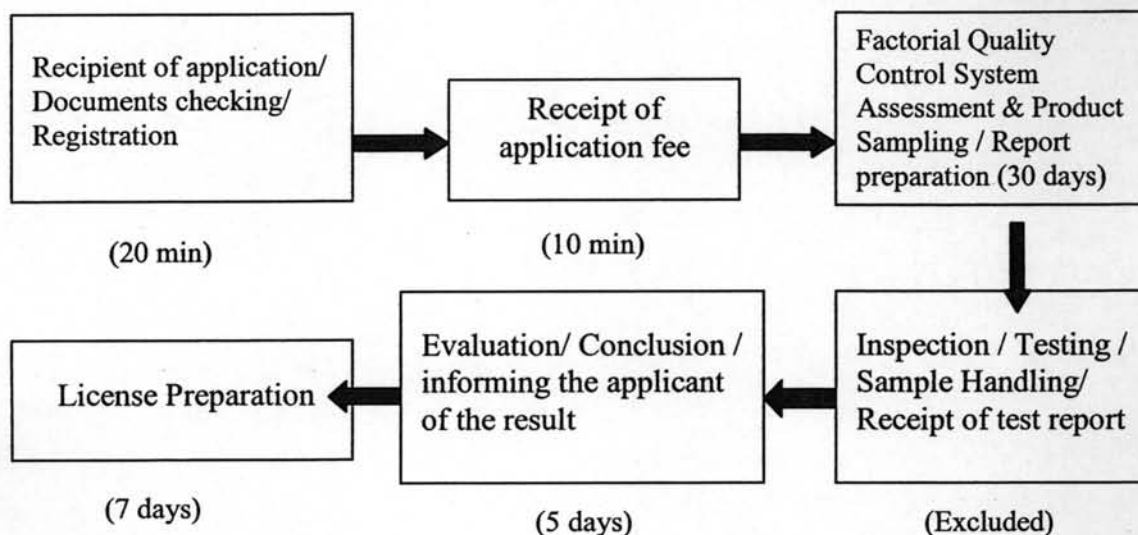
FACTORY ESTABLISHMENT AND ENVIRONMENTAL CLERANCE

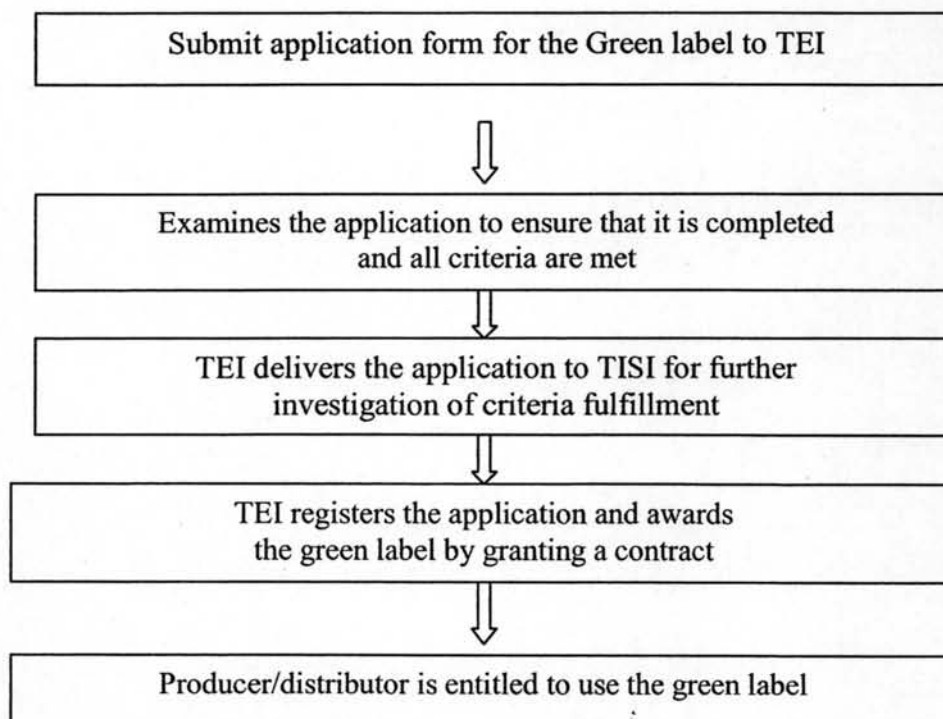
