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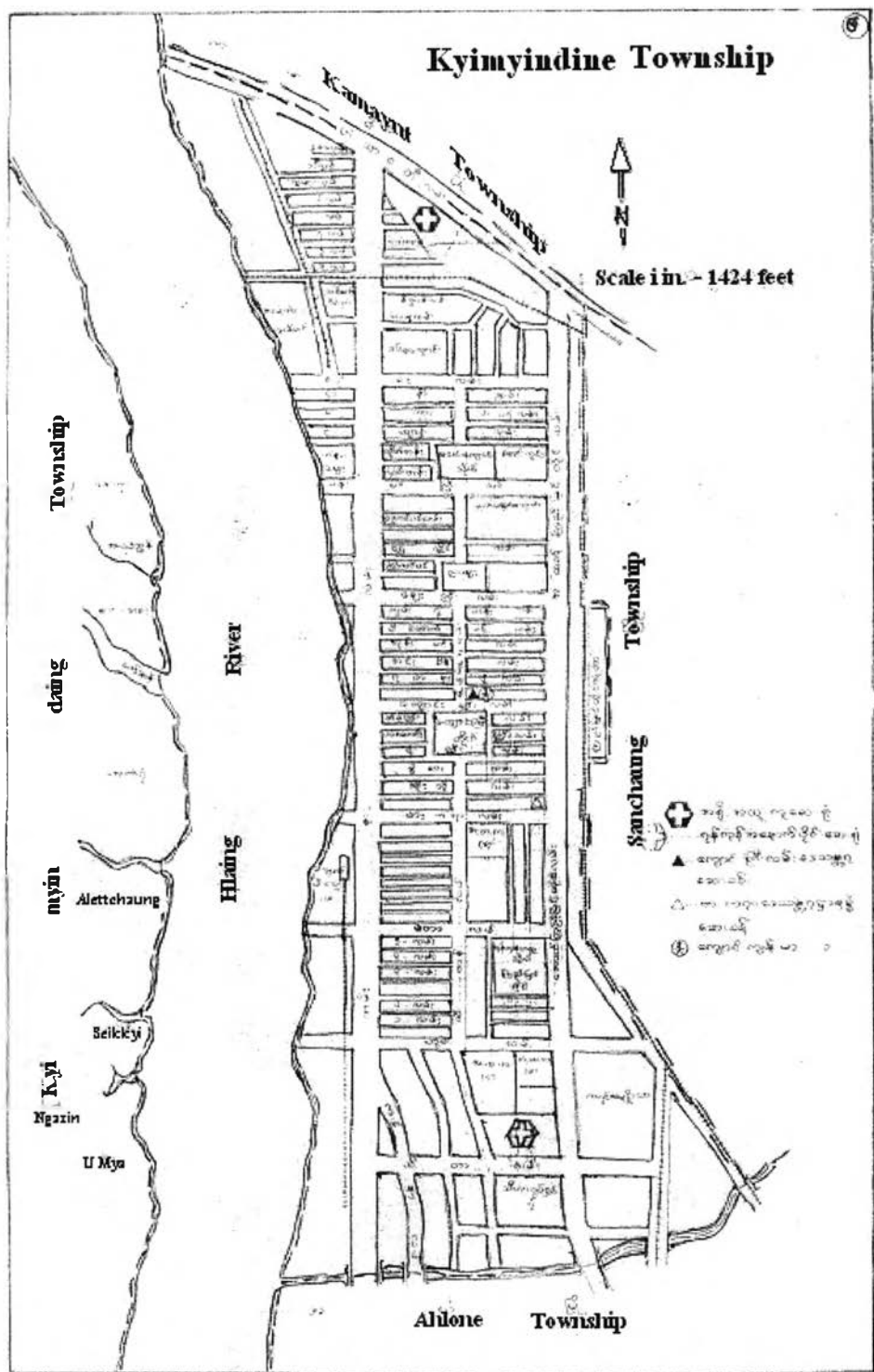

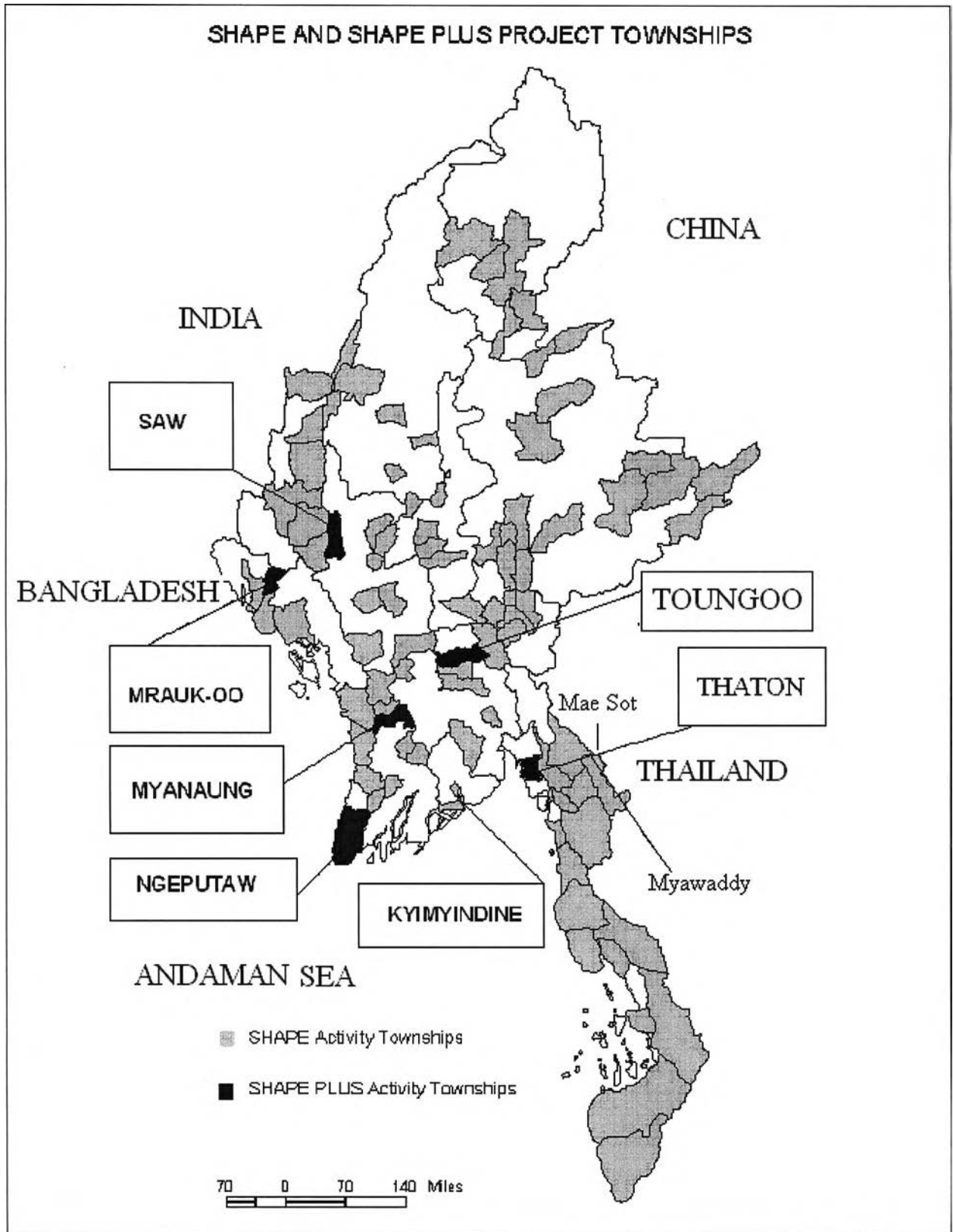

### SHAPE PLUS ACTIVITY TOWNSHIPS



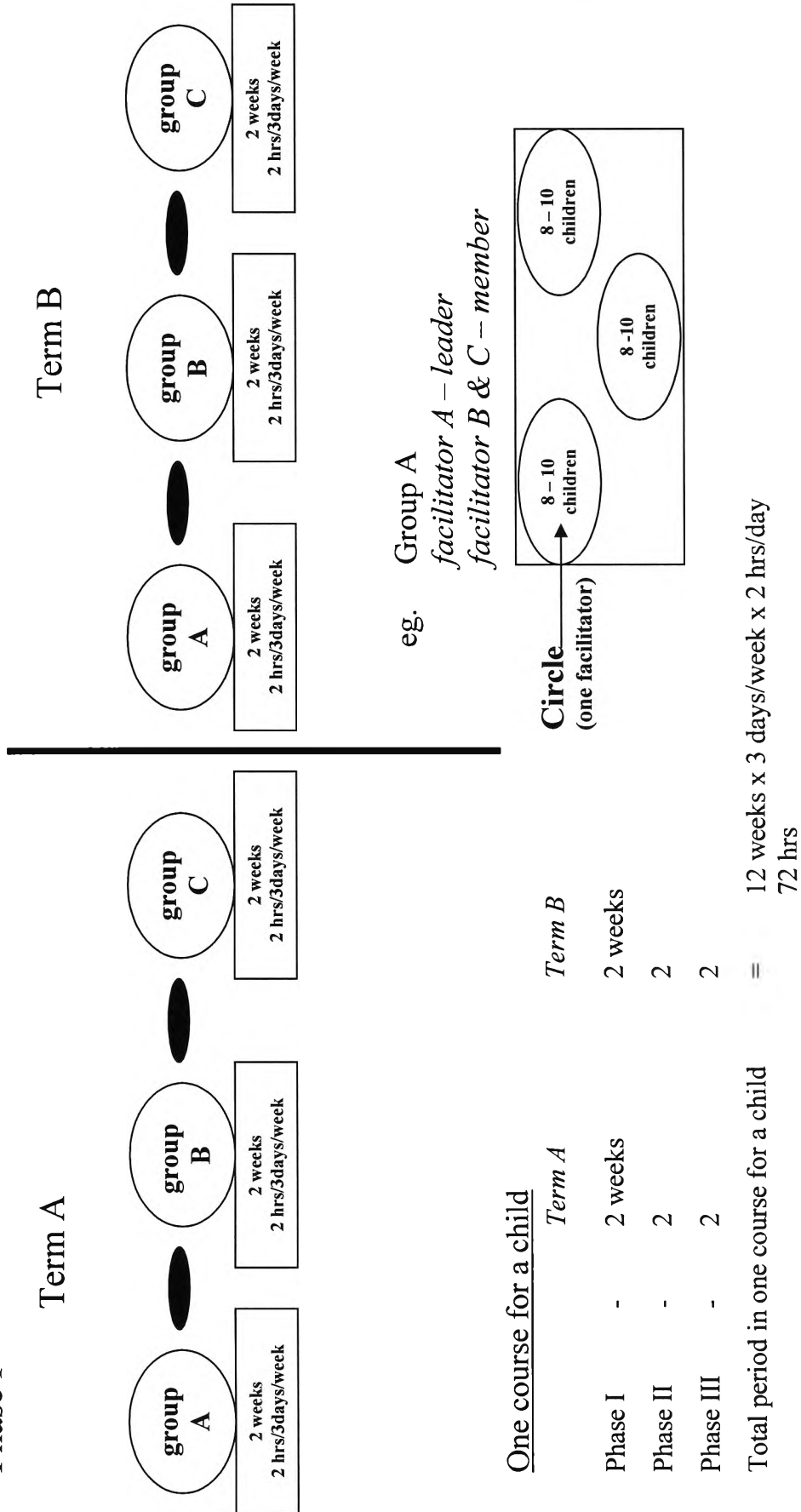

We are 5 in the family. I am the third. My second sister is married. I could not continue my education since my father died.

My eldest sister is now working in Myeik (in Tanintharyi Division near Thai border) where she has to cut raw fish in a factory. The lady agent said that she is now married. She sends her regards to us through the lady agent who finds jobs as housemaid in Myeik for the girls from our ward but we do not get direct contact with my sister. She went to work 6 years ago. But now if I were offered a job somewhere there I would not have gone. I have a cousin who ran away from that area. She told us that those agents sell them to another person. They were kept in a motor boat under lock and key but provided food. The next morning, 5 of them tried to get hold of the key, opened the lock and ran away. They found some men on the way and were asked where they were going. They just pretended that they were going to a nearby place and on their way to another motor boat, they found some Myanmar soldiers and with their help they were sent back to Myanmar. It happened recently. This cousin now works at Prawn industry removing prawn heads. My elder sister now 19 was married 5 years ago. Her husband takes drugs and mixes with bad girls. She is now separated and I think she has HIV as I see some lumps on her body now.
